This was my first snowstorm. Though I had seen snow on infrequent visits to these mountains, I had never seen it falling before. And fall it did, all night long. Finally, we all dozed off. In the morning, we sensed the gravity of our situation. The cabin sat beyond the region that the snow plough regularly serviced. Even we novices knew that there was no way to clear the road. The men dug a path to the cars and uncovered them but we were hopelessly cut off from the road. I, being the only Christian in our little group, began silently to pray for God's providence and asked Him to send the snow plough up to our desolate stretch of road. Soon others around me expressed anxiety, casting nervous glances at the glowering skies and up the impassable road. The snow kept falling steadily and silently. As the leaders were packing our kitchen supplies, one of them asked me, "I wonder what made the ploughman come up this far?"

I simply smiled and said, "I prayed".
